#### We glorify you.


Jesus Christ, the resurrection and the life, who suffered death for all humanity, who rose from the grave to open the way to eternal life: We praise you. We praise you.

#### The Lord be with you. **And also with you**.


Lift up your hearts. **We lift them to the Lord**.

#### THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

Remember our brother Ken, whose baptism is now complete in death. Bring him into your eternal joy and light, together with all who have died in the peace of Christ; through whom, and with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all glory and honor is yours, almighty God, now and forever.
